

Mr. Conrad,

We currently have 6 graphing calculators that are "functioning" but have damaged screens. They are "functioning" in the sense that when you put batteries in them and turn them on the screen comes on, however the display is unreadable and therefore unusable for us or the students. 4 of the calculators are the older TI-83 calculators that have a buy back value in "poor" condition (they are considered poor because they do not have the front covers or the battery covers) of \$12 a piece. There are also 2 of the newer TI-84+ calculators that have a buy back value in "poor" condition of \$21 a piece. That would give us roughly \$90 because the company pays for shipping and handling. That is about the same as a new graphing calculator today. I know that this does not sound like a great trade 6 for 1, but these 6 are of no use to us because of the damage to them and we could potentially get 1 that would be usefully for years down the road.
