K-Prep Data Release:

Due to this being a transition year to the new accountability system, districts are not receiving overall scores or classifications this year. The attached data charts break down the proficiency levels for each grade level and subject.

Some key data findings are:

- Every grade level increased in reading proficiency except for 4th and 7th. We have seen this same trend over the last 3 years- slight gain in every grade except for two.
- Every grade level decreased in math proficiency. This is very different than the trend we've seen in the last 3 years where math has increased at every grade level.
- 5th grade increased proficiency in Social Studies. That's the first gain we've seen in the last 3 years.
- 6th grade had the highest percentage of proficiency in reading. They were the highest last year also.
- All three assessed grades increased significantly in proficiency in on-demand writing. Both 3rd and 8th grade are still below 30%.
- 11th grade on-demand was 60% P/D and only 10% Novice. This is a huge gain from previous years.
- End of course proficiency increased for Algebra II, Biology and US History. Novice also decreased for all three of these courses. End of course proficiency decreased for English II. Novice also increased significantly. All 4 increased in proficiency last year.
- The district graduation rate increased from 90% to 97.6%. CCHS increased from 94% to 98.3%.
- The district college and career readiness decreased from 76.6% to 59%. CCHS decreased from 76.6% to 61.5%.
- ACT overall composite score increased from 17.5 to 18.9.
