### Maintenance (Dwayne Smith)

- This past month maintenance had to tear out the wall behind the urinals in the main boy's restroom at High School to repair a drainpipe that had deteriorated and stopped up over the years.
- We have assisted in the install and set up of the new sprinkler system in the green house. The walk-in freezer at Winn now has a new cooling system since the old system has served well but its time had come. This required us to empty the freezer, transport to another building, and take back two days later.
- Our district forklift has two newly rebuilt hydraulic cylinders that were leaking and a new seat that was badly needed.
- We have addressed small issues at Head Start to help with their federal audit.
- The Head Start modular at High School now has a new shaded area over their playground that was built by the ATC carpentry class and we supplied the material.
- We are waiting on a new control board for the lights in RBC front office to come in and I have ordered an extra board for stock to help on turn around the next time this issue arises.
- With a break in the weather, we took the opportunity to fill in potholes around the district.
- We have just now in the past month turned our building to A/C for the summer since we have had such a cool spring.
- The 6<sup>th</sup> grade hallway now has new water fountains with a bottle fill.
- We have had some issues with the fire alarm in Middle School that have been addressed to solve problems of the system not working consistently.
- We are in process of putting individual regulators on the ovens in all kitchens after we found that there has been a fluctuation in pressures as they turn on and off which burns out the flame sensors.
- We are working through a problem of the main power breaker tripping in Cartmell sporadically, we are going to have a monitor installed to track our feed and this should give us the information needed to solve the issue.
- New walk through curtains have been added in all the walk-ins in the district to help with keeping a consistent temperature while the doors are open. Maintenance has closed 175 work orders this past month, we try to address all things by priority to keep everything running smooth.

We are fast approaching the end of our school year and that means preparations are being made for next year. We continue to make parents as aware as possible of the requirements for 6th grade physicals and immunization. Immunization certificates continue to trickle in.

Our CPR training is looking like it will occur during the first or second week in August. After that training all 5 nurses will be certified to teach CPR and be able to meet the entire district's needs.

We are also in the process of scheduling nurses to cover the summer camps. This is proving to be a challenge since most of us have already made plans for the summer months.
