Staff seems to be very impressed by how they work and feel much better about the level of sanitizing and disinfecting that is being done on a daily basis to help ensure our staff and students safety. Bulk orders of hand sanitizers and electrostatic sprayer chemicals have arrived. We will deliver the product needed to each school as their supply runs low. The district provided 6 hand sanitizer dispensers along with the sanitizer and 25 facemasks to assist iLEAD

We are currently in the process of teaching CPR and medication training to all staff. CPR certification is good for 2 years, so we had the bus drivers all due this year and have just completed that training. Middle School has completed their certified staff. CPR will continue in all other schools to get all staff trained who are due.

We have been introduced to the new online registration completed by the parents, and this is proving to be most helpful to us. We are able to access the condition and medication information on line. This is a huge help in organizing the IHP's (Individualized Health Plans) for those students with conditions.

We are continuing work on a protocol for temperature checks when students return to the building. We have purchased thermometers for each classroom since this is the first indication of illness.

We have entrance physicals scheduled to be done at TRIAD on August 25th. Parents will call TRIAD for an appointment. Physical forms to be completed will be provided to them. We appreciate their willingness and continue our joint ventures with them.

Transportation (Darren Dunn)

All employees are back full time and have finished the 8 hour update. Our update consisted of:

- Guest speaker: Dave Roberts - Child abuse and human trafficking and signs to watch for
- Went over Covid related issues / safety precautions guide lines from KDE
- Review bus inspections and how to properly fill out the inspection sheet
- CPR Training
- Dealing with behavioral issues on the bus
- Going over safety issues and requirements for sanitizing buses and taking temperatures when returning to school and seating manifest.

Drivers are now working on their safe school trainings.

- Received a donation of 52 new backpacks from the Carrollton Christian Church.

- Helped a fire victim family out by collecting/delivering donations, referring to Ghent Baptist Church, and purchasing clothing and person items for them.
