This past month we have seen a flare up again of our usual winter illnesses. We are seeing multiple cases of Flu, both A, B, and H1N1, strep throat, stomach virus, pneumonia, and other virus related illnesses. KWP has had a new diagnosis of Celiac Disease, requiring nursing oversight. We have had yet another brand new diabetic added to the schedule at the Middle School. This makes 7 active diabetics at the Middle School, which has become quite the challenge for the nurse on a daily basis. With this number of diabetics, daily meds required of the nurse at the Middle School, we have added an intermittent support system: One day per week and for other times requiring coverage, the KWP nurse goes to the MS to assist with the load. The nurse from Head start is covering KWP when she is out of the building. This seems to be working well thus far. All our nurses are willing to be flexible to ensure all student's health needs are met.

TRIAD continues to be at the Middle School for 2 hours two days per week and at the High School for 2 hours 2 days per week. This seems to be going well at this time.

At Cartmell, we continue our vision and hearing screening for the 3rd grade. We still have 2 classes to go and will be completing those before the end of February. This has gone well and we have made several Optometry referrals from this process, and at least one Audiology referral.
