1. Our current enrollment stands at 19 students – 6 Middle School – 13 High School. Of these, 3 are expelled, 10 are referred and 6 are here voluntarily.
2. Several students are working to meet their contracts so they may return to their traditional school in August.

4. We have continued our Robotics program and students have completed their fifth robot for this year.
5. Ms. Welch is inviting local people to give career presentations to our students every Friday.

12. A group of educators from Spencer County visited us to look over our use of the Edgenuity program in the District. It was a large delegation and they were all very complimentary of our program.
